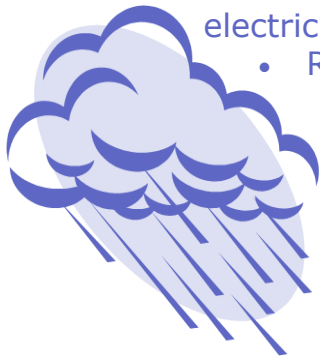


HURRICANE SEASON

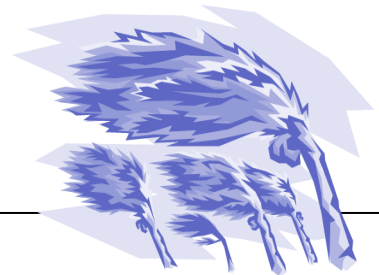
BEFORE THE HURRICANE



- Enlist several members who can turn off the utilities (water, electricity, and gas)
 - Relocate any church vehicles to sturdy shelters
 - If possible, board up windows
 - Maintain several tarps to be used to cover any damages
 - Store all outdoor items, (benches, chairs, trashcans, playground equipment, etc.)
 - Inventory all church owned property
 - Contact a qualified contractor to perform the following: trim back any dead or weak branches from trees, especially near the church, parsonage, or power lines and clear loose and clogged drain gutters and down spouts

DURING THE HURRICANE

- Stay tuned to local television and radio stations for emergency information
- Keep in mind that the eye of a hurricane is calm and winds will resume



AFTER THE HURRICANE

- Wait until the area is declared safe before inspecting you church property
- Check gas, water, and electrical lines for damage
- Check all appliances and equipment for damage
- Avoid using open flames, use battery operated flashlights
- Report any life threatening emergencies to local authorities
- Please use the telephone sparingly
- Take photographs of all damaged areas
- Call our claims representatives to report any damages (800) 922-5332
- Make any temporary repairs to protect your church from further damages or cover with tarps. Do not make any dangerous repairs
- Please be patient, **ALL** claims will be settled as fast as humanly possible



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
